The Season of the Great Lent will begin on February 12, 2024 with Ash Monday.



Ash Monday

The Liturgy for Ash Monday [February 12] will be at 7:30 p.m. Ashes will be given at the Liturgy. Ash Monday is a day of complete fast and abstinence. Every Friday of Lent is a day of Abstinence.

Lenten Observances and Devotion

The following Lenten guidelines are observed in the Eparchy of Saint Maron.

- ★ All Maronites who are physically capable are to **abstain from meat** on Ash Monday (**February 12**) and all Fridays of Lent.
- ★ Ash Monday and the Great Friday of the Crucifixion are also days of fasting. Fasting in the Maronite Church involves eating and drinking nothing at all (except water and medicine) from midnight until noon. The rest of the day normal meals can be taken, but without meat. All Maronites who are physically capable are to fast on these two days.



Lenten Services

Starting on Friday, February 16, 2024, and every Friday of Lent thereafter, we will have a Divine Liturgy followed by the Benediction with the Holy Cross at 7:30 p.m. Following the Liturgy a simple lenten (meatless) meal will be served in the social hall.

FYI

What is conscience?

Conscience is the inner voice in a man that moves him to do good under any circumstances and to avoid evil by all means. At the same time it is the ability to distinguish the one from the other. In the conscience God speaks to man.

Conscience is compared with an inner voice in which God manifests himself in a man. God is the one who becomes apparent in the conscience. When we say, "I cannot reconcile that with my conscience", this means for a Christian, "I cannot do that in the sight of my Creator!" Many people have gone to jail or been executed because they were true to their conscience.
