
Lenten Observances 2020

For us Maronites, Lent begins on Ash Monday, February 24, 2020 and lasts until Holy Saturday (April 11) at noon. The following Lenten guidelines

are observed in the Eparchy of Saint Maron.

- ★ All Maronites who are physically capable are to **abstain from meat** on Ash Monday (**February 24**) and all Fridays of Lent.
- ★ Ash Monday and the Great Friday of the Crucifixion are also days of **fasting**. Fasting in the Maronite Church involves eating and drinking nothing at all (except water and medicine) from midnight until noon. The rest of the day normal meals can be taken, but without meat. All Maronites who are physically capable are to fast on these two days.

Sunday of the Righteous and the Just


